

A meeting was held on 2 December 1999.

Councillors present were Messrs, J. Prouse, D. Poole and Mrs. J. Elliott.

A proposal to erect a bus shelter at Crossway was once again discussed and the matter will be put on hold for the time being due to lack of finances.

It is expected a re-cycling pavilion will be made available at the parish hall car park in the new year.

Torridge District Council have acknowledged the parish council's letter regarding the new Local Plan.

The pre-cept budget was discussed and it was decided to apply for the minimum amount needed to run the council and any plans for millennium commemorations should be self-funding.

Fund raising for the millennium celebrations on 19 August 2000 are to begin and a meeting will be held in the parish hall on 14 January 2000 at 7.30 p.m.

There were no planning applications to be considered.

The date of next meeting is to be decided in the new year.

The Sunday Club is held on Sunday mornings at 11am at the Methodist Church. Children and young people join the first 20 mins of the service, then to their own activities in the Schoolroom, including art, crafts, cooking, Bible stories, drama and music. We cover from age 2 years to teens and have toys and books on hand for little ones. Contact Lilian (tel:261355) or Sheila (Tel:261466) for more details. We welcome any local young people.

The Youth Club is held fortnightly on Fridays in the Schoolroom, from 7pm to 9pm. It is mainly run by parents who take turns to help and is strongly supported by the Methodist Church, including free use of the rooms. Members are charged "subs" of 30p per meeting and refreshments are on sale at reasonable prices. Sessions include sports, crafts, special guests, cooking and some trips out. The Methodist Church Services are held on Sunday mornings at 11am. Family and congregational services are held 2-monthly; other services are led by our Minister and preachers from the local area. There are occasional Gospel Specials, offering a range of excellent music for all ages. We would be delighted to welcome any-one into our Church Family at any time! Also within the area we are fortunate to have Deaconess Anita Hart (Tel: 281901) a Rural Worker able to offer understanding concern and supportive encouragement to any in the North/West Devon area who are suffering undue stress for whatever reason.

Community Coffee Mornings are held on the last Thursday of each month. It is an opportunity for all in our community to get toether over a cup of coffee and meet with friends and neighbours. A bring and buy stall proceeds are donated to local charities - so far £30 to Holsworthy Well Park Centre and £30 to Children's Hospice South West. Also a donation of £10 to Indian Cyclone Disaster Appeal.

Bible Study & Prayer Group - a few of us meet on alternate Tuesday evenings to share our thoughts on a selected section of the Bible, using a guide to keep us in line with the theme - last session we considered various aspects of Love, and recently we have been thinking about Work and Materialism from a Christian perspective. We also pray for any matters of concern in our daily news, for individuals in our community, and any other concerns we have.
