

Moved by R. Gifford, seconded by J. Lang that the clerk write to the District Council respecting the encroachment on the Highway at Shope by Mr. William Oliver.





## PLANTING OUR MILLENNIUM YEW

Our young yew tree is from the Linton Yew in Linton Churchyard, Herefordshire and is thought to be over 4,000 years old, alive at the time of Christ. A true millennium tree. The yew tree becomes a symbol of the spiritual life with its dormant periods and then its coming to life. It also stands for the risks and threats to our environment which we have created. In planting this tree we express our hope and vision for a better future. The official tree planting ceremony is due to take place in the Parish Church on Sunday 9 April 2000 at 3 p.m.

The invitation to attend is open to everyone and it is hoped many of you will come along to this parish event. Refreshments will be served following the ceremony.

The tree was offered by the Conservation Foundation three years ago and the parish council were keen to apply for a piece of history. Bearing in mind the risk to grazing animals the councillors considered the churchyard the most appropriate planting place in the parish.
