2) <u>Chairman's Announcements</u>

Chairperson Councillor Stephen Moyse welcomed all to the meeting, and in his absence wished Councillor Gareth Piper a very happy 50th Birthday

4) <u>Public Comments, County and District Councillors reports:</u>

Devon County Councillor Barry Parsons apologised for being late, but had been to another meeting. Barry reported that Holsworthy Hospital is now being used by approx. 2,000 people for different causes, which is a very large increase from last year. There are no 'end of life' facilities there but there is at Deer Park, where three beds are available, and there are 4 more beds at Stratton.

There are meetings every two weeks at Holsworthy Hospital to which I attend. There is a great relationship Between us and Stratton/Bude Councillors and in Particular Dave Parsons, our no 1 duty is to ensure people are safe and well looked after. What I really want is the 16 beds back at Holsworthy Hospital, but we have a shortage of Clinical support. What we need is more young people helping the older generation and vice versa. Stephen Moyse enquired about rural bus services that could potentially be pulled, due to lack of use stopped, Barry replied that £70,000 a year is spent on supporting Rural Routes, he is still hopeful that this would not happen he had spoken to our MP and will have talks with Stagecoach.

Barry said he was a bit disappointed with the complaints regarding the bus shelter but did understand the problem. He would like some sort of acknowledgement to the late Ken Carroll for his help in having the shelter supplied. The Chairperson Councillor Stephen Moyse suggested that when the weather has improved, he will arrange a ceremony for the bus shelter with maybe a small plaque dedicated to Ken, on the same day also officially open the D.A.A.T night time site, inviting the local community to attend. Councillor Parsons said that would be great and would be appreciated.

The Chairperson Stephen Moyse thanked Barry for attending.

5) The minutes_of_the Parish Council meeting held on the 15th January 2020 had been circulated by email, were read and approved by all Councillors, they were duly signed by the Chairperson Councillor Stephen Moyse as being a true record of the meeting.

6. <u>Matters Arising</u>

- 1) Air Ambulance site -update, all had been erected and installed, the new meter supplied by Eon had been installed and it is hoped that the installation would be operational by Friday the 28th.
- Councillor Stephen Moyse sends his thanks to all who have made this very important facility possible
- 2) The new Notice Board had now been erected, and the old one disposed of, thanks go to Councillor Barry Parsons for his grant of £400 towards the cost.
- 3) Badgers Halt, it had been established that the property is actually in Thornbury, the result of the enquiry established that Devon Highways had not financed any road resurfacing in that area.
- 4) Road from Youlden Lane-Five Lanes, this had been reported to Highways by the Clerk
- 5) Bus shelter at Holsworthy Beacon, complaints had been received regarding the lack of 'shelter' from this It had been reported to those responsible for its erection and the Parish Council were told that no side panels could be added to the shelter as it would obstruct the vision of those exiting the crossroads.
